If you want to follow Jesus your Faith has to be tough...we all have expectations of how Jesus will operate and about how life's supposed to be following him...However Jesus makes it cler...He and therefore we are on a mission from God!

...A mission is an adventure... it is an adventure of faith...combined with God's work.

So as the completion and point of him coming is getting closer He starts the last leg of his journy south toward Jerusalem...to his destiny... We pick up the narrative...

NLTLuke 9:51 *As the time drew near for him to ascend to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem.*

Jesus knew well what was before him and knew time is short...there were still many towns to visit...the way must be prepared...for there are other sheep...

 $\tilde{NLTJohn}$ 10:16 I have other sheep, too, that are not in this sheepfold. I must bring them also. They will listen to my voice, and there will be one flock with one shepherd.

So he sends his disciples to find them....and he will send us also... They decide to follow him...the journey begins...the methodology may be different but the purpose is the same generation to generation

NLT LK 10:1 The Lord now chose seventy-two¹ other disciples and sent them ahead in pairs to all the towns and places he planned to visit.

• The seventy-two remind us that we all have role in the mission of Christ. The first thing we are told in this passage is that Jesus sends the disciples out in pairs. They go out two-by-two,

a reminder that the mission is one that is shared by all, not owned by one.

- The communal aspect of the mission is essential. Jesus invites us into a relationship with him and each other. This is reflected in the manner by which we conduct the mission.Following Jesus gets real...really quick... the first thing they are confronted with is a mission... when you are with Jesus ...there is going to be change...
- so Jesus sends them out with nothing so that they learn the first lesson in serving Jesus ... extremely important to be internalized...You and Jesus is really overkill...or more than enough for any situation.. but you must do it his way!!

² These were his instructions to them: "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. <u>So pray</u> to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to send more workers into his fields.

First, Jesus asks his disciples to pray. Prayer precedes mission and, as we will see later in the gospel, pervades the mission.

- 1. In this case Jesus instructs the disciples to pray for more "laborers," fellow disciples of Jesus who will join in the mission. The mission is going to go out to all the earth...a lot of laborers will be needed
- 2. ALSO this reveals that God is deeply concerned with the development of His people, not so much the condition of the fields of the world.
- 3. it is far easier to pray for condition of the harvest than finding more workers to go into the file of harvest. One requires nothing the other that requires getting involved with the Harvest field...you know people who are lost, troubled, distressed, blind, in bondage, oppressed !.....

- 4. When we pray what God wants ...we always get it... when you pray lord help me to love others...that is always his will...so you will get it...and you will be the answer

³Now go, and remember that I am sending you out as lambs among wolves.

- He is sending them as lambs among wolves...I think sending them out as lions among Lambs would be a more effective strategy...
- I mean What would a lamb feel like amongst wolves? Vulnerable, weak, scared, depressed, unprotected, deficient, unprepared...
- When you go ...you will feel and rightly so... in one word completely inadequate. Get used to it
- <u>So wonder he said pray for workers...it is not a job for the faint</u> of heart but faith of heart, Stout of Heart
- In fact if you feel capable like a lion... ... probably not God leading... because when he leads ... we have to lean on him!
- So why does the harvest field fell like wolves so often to us?
- Lets break down why he would say this?
- when Scripture uses the word world it has three meanings in scripture:
- **1. It sometimes means the physical world...the earth** NLT AC 17:24 "He is the God who made the world and everything in it. Since he is Lord of heaven and earth, he doesn't live in man-made temples"
- 2. It also can mean human world or mankind...

^{NLT JN 3:16} "For this is how God loved the world: He gave^[g] his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life.

3. <u>It also can mean The world system which is controlled by the</u> <u>enemy in complete opposition to Jesus</u>

NLT 1 John 5: 19 We know that we are children of God and that the world around us is under the control of the evil one.

• We are of the Kingdom of God yet live in the physical world whose systems are under Satan's control...and in absolute opposition to God....

...no wonder we will feel like a lambs among wolves in the harvest field! Because We are!

So how do these disciples do it...Jesus said go!

KJV Luke 10:3 Go your ways: behold, I send you forth as lambs among wolves.

They would go as 36 team ...but he would follow.. This leaves much room for their own decision making...

- **1.** They would need to make decisions on how they would carry out the command to go before him.. where to go and and what to do when there...
- 2. <u>This is where our responsibility comes in...our giftings and</u> <u>talents and Passion, they would need to improvise and</u> <u>strategize...</u>
- **3.** They would need to be gentle, careful, handling aggressive rejection (the wolves) and those who would receive their message...
- 4. there would be risk, danger, and reward but don't be afraid...expect it...Jesus did and told them so...

Then he gives traveling instructions

NLT ^{LK 10: 4} Don't take any money with you, nor a traveler's bag, nor an extra pair of sandals. And don't stop to greet anyone on the road.

- You are not on a vacation...you are on a mission! No sight seeing, visiting relatives or friends, No Suit cases with changes of clothes and shoes ,or spending money
- Remember Jesus does not have long to live...time is of the essence...
- Now it was time for them to follow his example, so he gave them some final instructions and sent them out to do as he had done.

- It is apparent these towns were at least knowledgeable of the Messiah...
- Their mission was to preach about the kingdom of God, to drive out demons and to cure people of their diseases.
- The curing and delivering is not dependent on the people being disciples. The care represents Jesus' care for all people especially those in need.
- He did not send them out powerless. He gave them power and the authority to preach, to drive out demons and to heal the sick.
- inform them Jesus will be visiting their town shortly

- They were instructed to stay where you are received in only one house and stay as long as they were welcome.
- The Home receiving them would be blessed.
- The hospitality offered them will be well earned

But also expect rejection... some would go to more than one town

- Each town would be held accountable for their rejection of the Kingdom of God Leave them to their choice

- He says the cities that reject you...will experience great sorrow...some versions say "Woe"... "Woe" is not a condemnation. It's a declaration of deep regret.
- 2. For if Tyre and Sidon, both pagan cities, who through History had been thorns in the side of Israel and often led it into idolatry. And Jezebel, the most wicked queen in the history of Israel, was a princess of Sidon...

N. "Satan falling like lightening" is not a literal heavenly event (there are

O. "Satan" in the Old Testament was pictured in Job and Zechariah as the

prosecuting attorney or the "accuser"—the one who insists that humans deserve

damnation. Hence, Jesus' expression declares the defeat of the case for the prosecution.

P. The language echoes language of Isaiah and Ezekiel, used in reference to

earthly kings being brought down by the hand of God. Thus, Jesus sees the beginning of

the end of Satan's rule over man.

Q. Perhaps the significance in Jesus' mind was that his message had now

been transferred with power to the second generation of teachers. His mission would have

been a failure if he'd left no one behind who could continue the work. He had now put

men in place who could continue after his death, which, in a very real sense, made his

death possible.

R. It's important to remember that our ultimate reward is in heaven. Jesus can

bless us on earth, but it's nothing compared to the final reward.

IV. Jesus' gratitude

D. Interesting that Jesus may not choose to reveal himself to everyone, just those he chooses. But, of course, the 72 and the 12 were sent only to the Jews. It wasn't

yet time to reach the Gentiles, but Jesus clearly anticipates the coming of that time. **V. The blessing**

NLT 2 COR 4:4 Satan, who is the god of this world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. They are unable to see the glorious light of the Good News. They don't understand this message about the glory of Christ, who is the exact likeness of God. ⁵ You see, we don't go around preaching about ourselves. Many years ago I was camping with my husband, and a neighbor family, when we were approached by two college aged girls who said they were sent out by their church in the same manner as Jesus had sent the Twelve Disciples. I was very skeptical and my feelings have not changed to this day. For one thing, I didn't see them perform any miracles. In Bible times, it was customary for strangers to the city gate where someone might take them in for the night. No such custom exists in America.

Yet there are people such as Mother Teresa who have become paupers for the sake of serving others. The 72 were told to do good when the entered a community...

^{*LK* 10: 5} "When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' ⁶ If a man of peace is there, your peace will rest on him; if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Stay in that house, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house.

^{LK 10:8} "When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is set before you. ⁹ Heal the sick who are there and tell them, `The kingdom of God is near you.' Those were direct commands...

Now notice in the circle there is room on both sides of God's moral will...

this is because when we violate God's moral will...his sovereign will is there to contain God's sovereign purposes in those he has called and in his plan in general...

- when God's moral will is violated ...we exist outside his intended will ...and thereby ..he works to bring us back into compliance with his moral will.
- ➢ God secretly guides us by working all events together for the believer's good.
- Now when we operate within the circle of God's moral will...defined commands we enter into the place of free will...
- \succ Where there is no command there is Freedom...

GE 2:15 The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. ¹⁶ And the LORD God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; ¹⁷ but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die."

- ≻ One command...one tree do not eat from
- ➢ One consequence…death…separation
- ➢ Great Freedom to choose as he would...any other tree...
- Once again the will of God for one is tied up in the will of God for everybody...

This is where our responsibility comes in...our giftings and talents...and Passion...

As Augustine said" where there is no command, God gives us freedom to choose...

You see we all have dreams and gifts and we have responsibility to use them...

^{2CO 3:17} Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is *freedom*.

The result will be...success

LK 10:17 *The seventy-two returned with joy and said, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name."*

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two issues:

1)we are outside the expressed will of God ...need to get that right...repent change direction

2)we are in the process of making some decisions...and need wisdom...ask God

JAS 1: ⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him. ⁶ But when he asks, he must believe and not doubt, because he who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. ⁷ That man should not think he will receive anything from the Lord; ⁸ he is a double-minded man, unstable in all he does.
