12112022. Who is the Baby Jesus? A television interviewer was walking streets of Tokyo at Christmas time. Much as in America, Christmas shopping is a big commercial success in Japan. The interviewer stopped one young woman on the sidewalk, and asked, "What is the meaning of Christmas?" Laughing, she responded, "I don't know. Is that the day that Jesus died?"

In a sense there is a profound truth to her answer. I don't know!

This world is happy to let Jesus Christ be a baby in a manger, but do not want Him to be God. Yet that is the central truth of the Christmas story: the Child of Christmas is God!

The core of all Christmas truth. God with us...Immanuel

NLT Matt 1:22 All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet: ²³ "Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" The prophecy of Isa 7:14

- People love Him as an infant, But they cannot bear the thought of God in human flesh.
- · People even sing of His nativity, but reject His authority.
- I. <u>Christmas is not just about the Savior's infancy; it is about His deity.</u> The humble birth of Jesus Christ was never intended to conceal the reality that God took on a human body to be born into the world.

But that is the world...Yet often we who believe Jesus is God in the flesh still walk in great fear even though He is with us!

Why? our biggest fears are based on a misunderstanding of who God is...

- Our first mistake is thinking he is like us by nature...He is not like us by nature ...He is God.....
- Even when he became human...he did not give up his God DNA...he is God with us!!

***NU 23:19 God is not a man, that he <u>should lie</u>, nor a son of man, that he should change his mind. Does he speak and then not act? Does he promise and not fulfill?

- He is not a man...so he does not have the fallibilities or limitations of man
- What God says he will do he does
- What he promises he fulfills...

There are two things about God which should really really impress us...to the degree it is pressed into us!

- 1. He never fails... You will find no scripture not one that says...God failed...God tried really hard but it did not work out
- 2. <u>He is never afraid...</u> You will find no scripture not one that says: God was afraid...trouble came and God was paralyzed with fear...or ran away and hid in some tall grass

So this means that anything God ultimately wants to happen will...100% happen..... God is not afraid of failure for he cannot fail...nor be thwarted in his plans......

Understood this truth...

Is a 46:10 I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say: My purpose will stand, and I will do all that I please.

you see God...he is never afraid of anything... for he knows the beginning from the end... because he is the beginning and is the end.. He knows how it will turn out...and it will turn out as he wants it to....he is Almighty! Nothing is more mighty than he!

NLT <u>Revelation 1:8</u> "I am the Alpha and the Omega—the beginning and the end," says the **Lord** God. "I am the one who is, who always was, and who is still to come—the **Almighty** One."

- He never fears that what he does will not turn out well...that is why following God is the wisest choice you can ever make, at any time in any circumstance...
- Our problem is we are four dimensional...height/length, width and depth...time....in other words we are in one place....at a time

We live in time and time linear...it move along a line...start to finish.....so we are linear...we are at one place at a time...if I am here, I am not there...

Now God has no such problem... for he exist Beyond these four visible dimensions...in dimensions beyond the physical/natural...into the invisible/supernatural... and had absolute control over them both...

But he has given us a way to kind of grasp his power...using our own visible dimensions

We humans are vastly different than The Lord!

ISA 55:8 "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD

Then he gives us two comparisons using our own visible dimensions

ISA 55:9 "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

- Let's put this into perspective ... How much higher and different is that? How much are his ways better than ours?
- Let look at the heavens are higher than the earth..

 Astronomers have located Galaxies 12.3 billion light years from earth.
- To grasp this...consider the fact that the sun is 93 million miles away...and that light escaping the sun travels at 186,000 miles per second reaches the earth in about 8 minutes.
- If we walk outside right now...the light rays you feel will be eight minutes old.
- <u>Tim put this up</u> Now light from the furthest galaxy traveling at 186,000 miles a second takes 12.3 billion years to reach us....that distance is virtually incomprehensible!!
- His ways or methods or plans are at least 12.3 billion light years better and more comprehensive that ours...
- So God has taken into consideration over 12.3 billion possible unforeseen events that could hinder his will, and 12.3 billion possible attempts to derail his will while also devising the appropriate counter moves to still accomplish his will... without breaking a sweat!
- It is embarrassing how routinely We give our thinking way to much credit. And sell him way to short... by at least 12.3 billion light years....
- So... your most thought out descision taking into every contingency you can think of on your best dayof planning, falls
 12.3 billion light years short of God planning capabilities.
- But wait there is more...

• Not only are his ways that much more comprehensive...His thinking is that much more comprehensive than ours...

ISA 55:9....so are my ways higher than your ways <u>and my thoughts</u> <u>than your thoughts</u>.

- Let me give you another example... comparing his thinking and processing power to ours...
- According to the <u>TOP500 rankings</u> for 2022, is the Frontier Super Computer.
- The USA made Frontier is built by Hewlett Packard Enterprise (HPE) and is housed at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) in Tennessee, USA.
- The Frontier is the first exascale supercomputer. This means it is capable of more than a billion times a billion operations a second (known as an Exaflop).
- <u>Tim put this up...</u> To give us some perspective A billion is 1 with 9 zeros behind it
- A billion times a billion 1,000,000,000 x 1,000,000,000 = a quintillion..... that is, a 1 followed by 18 zeros.1,000,000,000,000,000,000 or 10^18...a quintillion has 6 groups of zeros in 3s
- To achieve such formidable processing speeds, a supercomputer needs to be big. Each of Frontier's 74 cabinets is as heavy as a pick-up truck, and the \$600 million machine has to be cooled by 6,000 gallons of water a minute.
- However, A quintillion calculations a second is painfully slow and laughable to God who took every contingency of creation into account from beginning to end before a nanosecond had even ticked off the clock of time.
- You cannot see it, hear it, imagine it or conceive it...but it is there...

- Which is exactly what the Bible says about Jesus!
- John's gospel begins with a clear statement that Jesus is God: And Jesus Christ is the Agent of Creation.

John 1: 1 In the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He existed in the beginning with God. ³ God created everything through him, and nothing was created except through him.

- He was there at the beginning and he will be there at the end. And he is the Lord of everything in between.
- Truly he is the Alpha and Omega, the Creator, the Lord, the King.

He is also the Heir of all things...

Note Hebrews 1:2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe.

- To say that God has appointed Jesus heir of all things means that God has given everything to his Son. The deepest oceans. The farthest stars. The darkest corners. The highest mountains. It all belongs to him.



The term **light rays** often brings to mind a stream of light flowing through the sky or off of car headlights in the dark. However, not all light rays are visible, as there are infinite rays off of any given light. These infinite rays make up the electromagnetic spectrum. The human eye can only see visual light wavelengths between approximately 400 and 700 nanometers on the spectrum. The spectrum also contains light that we cannot see. Things like ultraviolet waves, x-rays, and gamma rays are contained on the blue side of the spectrum. Whereas radio waves, microwaves, and infrared waves are on the red side. None of which are visible.



Electromagnetic Visible Spectrum

In physics and optics, **light rays**, such as the stream from a flashlight, are simply a model of light. Although light is considered a wave with peaks and troughs, a line drawn through them at 90 degrees will produce a light ray in the direction the energy flows. Light can be reflected in other directions, like bouncing off of mirrors. It can also be refracted, like bending light through transparent materials. Both reflection and refraction are considered **ray tracing**.

- D. For nearly 2,000 years, debate has been raging about who Jesus really is.
 - 1. Cults and skeptics have offered various explanations.

⁹ Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest honorand gave him the name above all other names, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

⁴ "Woman, why do you involve me?" Jesus replied. "My hour has not yet come." ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." ⁶ Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons.

⁷ Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water"; so they filled them to the brim. ⁸ Then he told them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet." They did so, ⁹ and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. This is what he wanted to do, and it gave him great pleasure. ⁶ So we praise God for the glorious grace he has poured out on us who belong to his dear Son. ¹⁰ He is so rich in kindness and grace that he purchased our freedom with the blood of his Son and forgave our sins. ⁸ He has showered his kindness on us, along with all wisdom and understanding.

⁹ God has now revealed to us his mysterious will regarding Christ—which is to fulfill his own good plan. ¹⁰ And this is the plan: At the right time he will bring everything together under the authority of Christ—everything in heaven and on earth. ¹¹ Furthermore, because we are united with Christ, we have received an inheritance from God,¹³ for he chose us in advance, and he makes everything work out according to his plan.

Who was this child? He was God. The Scriptures are clear even though the world seems content to keep Him as a seasonal decoration, the baby in the manger was God Almighty! He was the Savior of the world.

This Christmas...can you see Him for who He really is? Do you know Him as your personal Savior? He came into this darkened world that we might literally see the light of His love and accept the greatest gift ever offered...eternal life!

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A. How do we explain the Almighty stooping to become a tiny infant? B. It was, of course, the greatest condescension the world has ever known or will ever know.

- C. Our minds cannot begin to understand what was involved in God's becoming a man.
- D. We will never comprehend why He who was infinitely rich would become poor.
- E. Why He would assume a human nature, and enter into a world He knew would reject Him and kill Him.

And he chose you... Think for a moment about these first two great statements. Jesus Christ is the Agent of Creation and the Heir of All Things.

- He was there at the beginning and he will be there at the end. And he is the Lord of everything in between.
- Truly he is the Alpha and Omega, the Creator, the Lord, the King.
- <u>Let's make this more personal.</u> Not only did the Lord Jesus create the universe, he also created you and me. <u>Psalm 139:14</u> says that we were "fearfully and wonderfully made." We owe every part of our physical existence to the Lord Jesus Christ.

John 21:25 Jesus did many other things as well. If every one of them were written down, I suppose that even the whole world would not have room for the books that would be written.

He is the light to whatever it is that cause darkness in you...

1 In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. ³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by

his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. (Hebrews 1:1-3).

I. He is the Heir of All Things.

"Whom he appointed heir of all things" (Hebrews 1:2).

- God has appointed Jesus as heir of all things. I understand this from a personal point of view. When my mother died earlier this year, I found out that my name had been written in her will. That meant that along with my brothers and sisters, I shared in my mother's estate. Just as my children are named in my will. And after I'm gone, they can go through my clothes and take anything they like. It's fine with me because I'm planning on a new wardrobe when I get to heaven.
- To say that God has appointed Jesus heir of all things means that God has given everything to his Son. The deepest oceans. The farthest stars. The darkest corners. The highest mountains. It all belongs to him.
- Today it doesn't appear that everything belongs to Jesus because Satan is a squatter who illegally claims the earth as his domain. But in the end Satan will be overthrown and Jesus installed as the rightful king of the universe.
- This means that when you come to the end of everything, Jesus is there! It may seem from a brief glance at the scoreboard that Satan is winning in the cosmic struggle between good and evil. But as they say in the election business, those are just "partial returns." When all the votes are counted, those who stand with Jesus will find themselves on the victorious side.

II. He is the Creator of the Universe.

Through whom also he made the universe" (Hebrews 1:2).

- Jesus is the agent of creation and the Lord of the epochs of history. At the Father's command, he brought the universe into being and he wrote the script for the unfolding ages.
- Through him God made everything. There are really only two choices a person can make as he studies the universe.
- Either you believe that everything is the result of infinite time plus blind chance or you believe
 that the universe is the result of divine design. This means that all true science leads back to
 God a designer. All true biology leads to God. All true botany, all true chemistry, all true physics,
 all true geology, and all true astronomy leads back to God. The Father delegated to his Son the
 work of bringing the universe into being and nothing was made except through him.

Think for a moment about these first two great statements. Jesus Christ is the Agent of Creation and the Heir of All Things.

- He was there at the beginning and he will be there at the end. And he is the Lord of everything in between.
- Truly he is the Alpha and Omega, the Creator, the Lord, the King.

- <u>Let's make this more personal.</u> Not only did the Lord Jesus create the universe, he also created you and me. <u>Psalm 139:14</u> says that we were "fearfully and wonderfully made." We owe every part of our physical existence to the Lord Jesus Christ.
- As one simple example, consider the intricacies of your own blood. <u>Leviticus 17:11</u> declares that "the life of the flesh is in the blood."
- Here is a statement made 3500 years ago that scientists now tell us is 100% accurate. Blood is truly the fluid of life. Your blood is made up of cells and plasma. As the blood flows through the heart, it is pumped through arteries, veins and capillaries to every part of your body.
- The blood delivers oxygen and nutrients and removes waste products. Adults have about 5.3 quarts of blood—almost a gallon and a half. A little over half is plasma, which contains electrolytes, nutrients and vitamins, carbohydrates, cholesterol, hormones, clotting factors, and proteins such as albumin and immunoglobulins which are really antibodies that fight infection.
- The cellular portion contains red blood cells (carry oxygen from the lungs), white blood cells (fight infection), platelets (help clot the blood so you don't bleed to death). Plasma (the liquid portion of the blood) is 90% water, yet the 10% of material dissolved in it is absolutely crucial for proper bodily function.
- These various elements are pumped by the body as directed by the brain to the places where they are needed most.
- Plasma also contains substances called electrolytes, such as sodium, potassium, chloride, bicarbonate, calcium and magnesium. These vital chemicals help in such things as fluid balance, nerve conduction, muscle contraction, and blood clotting. At the same time the plasma removes waste and sends it to the kidneys and to the lungs.
- All during this never-ending process, there is pressure from the heart that sends the blood outward and there is pressure inside the vessels produced by proteins in the blood that keep the blood level constant and the pressure rightly adjusted.
- When you take medication, it is the blood that rushes it along to the place where it is needed.

The blood flows into the right side of the heart and then goes to the lungs where it deposits carbon dioxide and picks up oxygen. From there the blood goes back to the left side of the heart and then out to the various parts of the body. The average adult heart beats 72 times per minute. In the course of one day the heart beats over 100,000 times. In one year the heart beats almost 38 million times, and by the time you are 70 years old it has beat 2.5 billion times! An average heart pumps 1.3 gallons per minute. In other words it pumps 1,900 gallons per day, almost 700,000 gallons per year, or 48 million gallons by the time someone is 70 years old. That's not bad for a ten-ounce pump!

And this just scratches the surface of what the blood does and how it works. And blood is only one part of your body. How can anyone study the complexity of the human body and think that it all happened by chance? It takes more faith to believe that than to believe that your body was divinely created by God.

Jesus is the Lord of your blood. He created it just for you. Every drop comes from him and every drop is precious to him.

III. He is the Radiance of God's Glory.

"The Son is the radiance of God's glory" (<u>Hebrews 1:3</u>). The word for radiance was used for sunlight streaming from the sun. Jesus is the blazing radiance of the glory of God. What sunlight is to the sun, Jesus is to God. It would be easier to try to separate sunlight from the sun than to separate the Son from God.

- If you want to know what God is like, look at Jesus. He is not some grimy, blurry image of the Almighty. He isn't the sun peeking through the clouds. He is the blazing, magnificent revelation of God himself.
- Jesus is a clear picture of God. He radiates the glory of God. Theologians have a word for this. They say the Son is "co-essential" with the Father. That means the Father and the Son share the same essence. The Father is God and the Son is God.

IV. He is the Exact Representation of God's Nature.

"The exact representation of his being" (Hebrews 1:3). The phrase "exact representation" comes from the Greek word charakter, from which we get the English word "character." Jesus shares in the character and essence of God. This word was used for the impression made by an engraving tool when it was stamped into metal in order to make a coin. The image on the coin was precisely the image on the engraving tool. So Jesus is stamped with the image of God. This is why Saint Athanasius declared, "Jesus whom I know as my Redeemer cannot be less than God."

He is the "radiance of God's glory" and the "exact representation of his being." These two expressions taken together are a powerful statement of the Son's full deity. Theologians refer to Jesus as the "only-begotten." That term means "one-and-only." We can truly say that not only is Jesus the Son of God, he is also God the Son. When we see Jesus Christ, we have seen as much of God as it is possible for us to see.

V. He is the Sustainer of All Things.

"Sustaining all things by his powerful word" (Hebrews 1:3).

- There is a vast movement in science today seeking to discover what makes the universe hold together. What is the power behind the power behind the power? What is the Ultimate Force in the universe?
- Our text makes clear that the answer is not a what but a who. What makes the universe hold together? Jesus Christ is the power behind all power. He holds the universe in place by his powerful word.
- Note that this is a present tense. Even now Jesus is "sustaining" the whole universe. All things
 hold together in him and for him and by him. His power is greater than nuclear power and his
 force is mightier than the mystical Force of the Star Wars movies. His might is mightier than the
 might of all the mighty men on earth.

- Think of it. Were he to say the word, the universe would be no more. Just a word and we would all perish. Do you realize that if Jesus stopped thinking about you, you would cease to exist? You owe your next breath to the fact that Jesus Christ is thinking about you.
- He sustains you so that you can breathe. Without him, you would not be reading these words.
- Jesus is the nucleus of creation and "the glue of the galaxies."

VI. He is our Savior.

"After he had provided purification for sins" (Hebrews 1:3

- Note the tense. It is "had provided," not "will provide" or "is providing." He died once for all time. His death on the cross was the complete payment for our sins.
- That is why he cried out, "It is finished." He purged us from our sins. I was dirty ... he was clean. He become dirty ... that I might be made clean.
- This means that all efforts at self-reformation as a means of salvation are doomed to failure. You can clean yourself up if you like, but it will not help you gain merit with God.
- It is only by Jesus' atoning death that we are forgiven by God. To add anything else to the work of Christ is of no benifit.
- Salvation means trusting Jesus Christ so completely that if his death is not enough to take you to heaven, you aren't going to go there.

Jesus died that he might save us. This is why the angel declared in <u>Luke 2:11</u> "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord"

VII. He is now seated at God's Right Hand.

"He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven" (Hebrews 1:3).

- He sat down when he returned to heaven because his work was done. Nothing can be added to the work Christ accomplished on the cross.
- When it comes to salvation, God is fully satisfied with the sacrifice of his Son. Nothing can ever be added to the merit of his blood.
- Until you come to the end of your striving and trust in him, you can never be saved. Until you are satisfied with what Jesus has done, you are still in your sins.

He sat down at the "right hand" of God. This is the place of highest honor. Jesus sits today at God's right hand because it is the highest honor God could give his Son.

• If there were another crown, he would wear it. If there were another honor, he would have it. But the "right hand" of God the Father is the highest honor in the universe. That's where Jesus is today.

We may therefore say with confidence that Jesus is at the very center of the universe. He is Lord and he is King. He is where God is. Even now Jesus reigns from heaven. Even now he reigns over the devil. He reigns over the elements of nature. He reigns over the past, the present and the future.

He reigns over cancer and heart attacks and over death itself. Someday soon he will return to the earth and reign visibly from David's throne in Jerusalem.

God has given him a name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father (cf. Philippians 2:9-11).

Today we confess this by faith. One day the whole universe will bow—willingly or unwillingly—to openly declare that Jesus is Lord.

Who is that Baby? Let us heed the answer of our text. He is ...

The Heir of All Things.

The Creator of the Universe.

The Radiance of God's Glory.

The Exact Representation of God's Nature.

The Sustainer of All Things.

Our Savior.

Now Seated at God's Right Hand.

That's who Jesus is. That's the One whose birth we celebrate at Christmas. This is the true identity of the baby born to Mary that night in Bethlehem 2000 years ago.

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To the architect he is the chief cornerstone.

To the banker he is the hidden treasure.

To the baker he is the living bread.

To the builder he is the sure foundation.

To the doctor he is the great physician.

To the educator he is the master teacher.

To the farmer he is the Lord of the harvest.

To the florist he is the lily of the valley.

To the geologist he is the rock of ages.

But who is Jesus to you? Do you know him? Do you know this Jesus? Is he your Savior?

This week a friend sent me an e-mail containing the following poem. It seems to summarize some of the truths we've talked about in this message:

The Word of God became flesh.

The Son of God became man.

The Lord of All became a servant.

The Righteous One was made sin.

The Eternal One tasted death.

The Risen One now lives in men.

The Seated One is coming again.

As we come to the close, let me encourage you to think carefully about who Jesus really is. You don't have to take my word for it. Check it out for yourself! This is far too important an issue to decide lightly. And you don't have to believe what I am saying just because I said it. Take the time to check things out. Read the New Testament. Make up your own mind. But whatever you do, don't be casual about Christ. What you believe about the Babe of Bethlehem is a life and death matter with eternal implications.

In just a few days Christmas will be here. Then all too soon we will launch into another busy year. Before you take down the ornaments and put away the Christmas music for another year, take time to discover who Jesus really is. Don't walk away from the manger this year without coming to grips with the tiny baby who sleeps there. Who is he? Where did he come from? Why was he born? And what difference does his coming make to you? Find out if what the angels said is true. And if it is true, make this a time to get to know him better. There is no more important quest in all the universe! If you will truly seek to know God, you will eventually be led by the Holy Spirit to Jesus Christ.

All that God has to say to us can be wrapped up in one word: "Jesus." And not just any Jesus, but only the Lord Jesus Christ revealed in the New Testament. He alone is the Lord from heaven. He alone can

save us. All that God has for you and me is wrapped up in his Son. No matter what difficulties we face or the decisions we must make, in the end God leads us back to that simple one-word answer: "Jesus."

In an interview with David Frost that was broadcast on PBS, Billy Graham said he hoped the last word he uttered before dying was simply this: "Jesus." We can't do any better than that.
